
Brno is a city offering friendly, cosmopolitan atmosphere, colourful festivities; it is a city entwined by grapevine and shaped by ancient winegrowing traditions. The Czech saying "small things are nice " holds true here. A guick tour of the historic centre takes only a few hours and you will still have some time left to explore interesting sights and exchange a few words with people you meet along the way. In short, falling in love and being fond of the city – bitterly, sweetly and forever – is not hard.



# BRNO IS

- → the second largest city in the Czech Republic with almost 400,000 inhabitants
- → a centre of universities, science, research and innovation
- a city of interesting architecture, notably from the period of Functionalism
- → a city of Villa Tugendhat, the only modern architecture landmark in the Czech Republic inscribed on the UNESCO World Heritage List
- → a city that boasts two castles Špilberk and Veveří
- → a city of exhibitions and fairs; the exhibition centre was ceremonially opened in 1928
- → a bishop's seat; the Brno Bishopric was founded in 1777
- → a city where Gregor Johann Mendel (1822-1884), abbot of the Old Brno monastery, discovered the laws of modern genetics
- → a city where the world-famous composer Leoš Janáček (1854–1928) lived and composed his music
- → a city of records; the present-day Mahen Theatre was the very first theatre in Europe illuminated by Edison's light bulbs as early as 1882
- → home to the tallest building in the Czech Republic (AZ Tower, 111 m)
- → a place where you can admire the most peculiar clockwork in the Czech Republic (náměstí Svobody square)
- → a city with the second largest ossuary in Europe located at St. James' Church
- → a city where the cathedral bells on Petrov chime midday at 11 o'clock; this relates to a legend dating from the time of the Swedish siege during the Thirty Years' War
- → a city of cafés, summer celebrations, festivals and fireworks
- > venue of the World Motorcycle Championship and other important sports events

#### Villa Tugendhat (9)

The Functionalist Villa of the Tugendhats with an untraditional lay-out and unique technological equipment, masterpiece of the architect Ludwig Mies van der Rohe from the 1930s, was inscribed on the UNESCO World Heritage List in 2001. The tour of the villa interior is in great demand and must be booked in advance; however, the garden may be visited without any previous arrangements.

18th centuries used to be the most notorious prison in the entire Habsburg Monarchy and was

known as the "Jail of Nations". It presently houses the Brno City Museum with permanent exhibi-

tions dedicated to the history of the castle and of the city and occasional art exhibitions. The public can also visit the casemates -

gloomy spaces in the bulwark originally designed as a shelter

for soldiers and later used as a prison for felons. The castle is

surrounded by a vast park giving views of the city.

the surface of roads and squares. The largest of them is the Labyrinth under Vegetable Market, historically the oldest public space in the city offering an interesting tour. You can also descend into the underground when visiting Mintmaster's Cellar in Dominican Square and the Ossuary under St. James' Church. This largest ossuary in the Czech Republic and the second largest in Europe holds the remains of more than 50 thousand deceased. The

#### The Cathedral of St. Peter and Paul (3) (4) Petrov 1 | www.katedrala-petrov.cz

The original Romanesque basilica on the Petrov hillock rebuilt in the Gothic style. The Gothic Revival style modifications come from the beginning of the 20th century. Besides the Baroque interior of the cathedral, both towers and the crypt are open to the public. The cathedral along with Spilberk Castle create the characteristic skyline of the city of Brno. You can descend from Petrov along the upper terrace of the Capuchin gardens to the Denisovy sady park.






The oldest and most interesting secular building in Brno, the seat of town councillors from mid-13th century. The council moved to the New Town Hall in Dominican Square as late as 1935. It features the legendary Gothic portal with a crooked turret and the passage "inhabited" by the famous dragon, beloved and respected symbol of the city of Brno. You can also visit its tower with a look-out gallery, information centre and exhibition spaces.










- The Era cafe 4 built in the Functionalist style is located near Tugendhat Villa. The simple and clean lines are complimented by a distinctively coloured staircase with a remarkable curve (Zemědělská 30), www.eracafe.cz
- Nomerční banka (5) in the Functionalist style was built based on the design by B. Fuchs and E. Wiesner in náměstí Svobody square.
- Single-storey Functionalist structure featuring an arched facade by architect Poříska at the junction of Nádražní and Bašty streets is the seat of the Čedok travel agency. 6
- The Villa Stiassni (14) designed by the architect E. Wiesner for the textile factory owner Alfred Stiassni and his family, is now open to the public after reconstruction (Hroznová 14), www.vilastiassni.cz

#### Brno City Museum (11) Špilberk 1 | www.spilberk.cz

The museum is based in Špilberk Castle. Besides a number of exhibitions focusing on architecture, visual arts and the history of Brno, the castle interior and its notorious jail, you can also visit its renowned casemates.

#### Moravian Museum (2) | Mendelianum

The second largest and also the second oldest museum in the Czech Republic, housing a collection of over 6 million items from the fields of natural and social sciences. Part of the museum is the Mendelianum, where the attractive world of genetics is presented.

You can meet the founder of modern genetics, G. J. Mendel, directly at the Augustinian Abbey in Old Brno, i.e. the place where this man of science lived, experimented and did his research.

An Art Nouveau villa that was occupied in the years 1913 to 1939 by the parents of Greta Tugendhat. Having been reconstructed the villa, its gardens and the former customs house are open to the public.

#### **Technical Museum in Brno**

A number of exhibits are dedicated, for example, to the history of transport, aviation and water-power and steam engines. Craftsmen's workshops and a play room with a host of interactive models are an inviting attraction.

In the city centre at the junction of Lidická and Pionýrská streets


The park offers leisure areas as well as a playground and a traffic-rules playground, pétanque zone, tennis courts, leash-free dog zone and an outdoor gym.


### Veveří Castle
